THE JOSEPH NICKERSON HEATHER IMPROVEMENT FOUNDATION.

This was launched in February 1985 to research into heather improvement to assist with upland conservation. The first £250,000 was donated by The Joseph Nickerson Charitable Trust.

The Foundation, which has its headquarters at Rothwell in Lincolnshire, will be working with various organisations concerned with heather management in the north of England and in Scotland. The Foundation is a registered charity.

Commenting on the project Sir Joseph Nickerson said:- "Heather is essential to the conservation of the uplands. If we can improve the heather and its environment we are helping to preserve some of the most beautiful areas of Britain which today are under threat."

GROUP NEWS

NORTHEAST (NEWCASTLE)

Our meeting on 24th November 1986 in Ponteland was prefaced by my referring to a very welcome visit from Mrs. Pamela Lee when she was on a visit to the North East. Several members of the committee were able to discuss various items of interest and in particular to learn of the many activities being carried out within the Society. She was quite surprised on an inspection of my garden to find various heathers and border plants giving a good show — so after all it seems that the North East is not too far behind our Southern gardens.

Mr. & Mrs. David Plumridge of Castleside near Consett, Co. Durham, who have recently joined the Society, entertained us with a slide illustrated talk entitled "The two Conversions"; No. 1 being to convert 1½ acres of pasture land to a landscaped garden with well over 300 heathers. To their advantage the soil is predominantly acid, and within a two-year period a very fine display has been achieved. The manual work has been undertaken entirely by our members, and Mrs. Plumridge was able to quote correctly all the various cultivar names without the customary plant labels. From our many questions it was obvious that we had enjoyed an instructive and memorable meeting. Our speakers are in fact relatives of the writer who they allege was responsible for their enthusiasm for heathers. A visit to the beautiful garden is planned for mid-summer, and the date will be in the Summer Bulletin.

SOUTHERN.

Unfortunately the Autumn Bulletin was published a few days after the planned visit to Leanardslee Gardens near Horsham on 26th October; therefore the revised timing of the visit and conducted tour mentioned came too late for the desired effect. In consequence some members toured the gardens alone thus reducing to little more than a dozen the number who were taken round by Mr. Robin Loder, the very knowledgeable owner of the property extending over 80 acres.

The visit was designed to witness the wide range of autumn colours for which the Gardens are renowned. The most welcome and extended 'Indian Summer' earlier in October seemed generally to be prolonging the life of the green foliage, but such is the incredible range of trees in this garden that Maples and several other varieties fully merited the viewing. Strangely some trees had shed almost entirely their summer clothing apparently due to the long autumn drought. An added attraction of this delightful arboretum was the wallabys many of whom had emerged from their leafy cover into the very pleasant autumn sunshine with which our visit was blessed.

The outstanding panoramic views are only made possible by the existence of a deep valley which accommodates a number of linked lakes. The 90 minute tour of the Gardens conducted by Mr. Loder enabled him to draw attention to trees of special significance either through age, scarcity in this country or size and also many shrubs seldom seen elsewhere.

The great agility of our Chairman over this extremely undulating course bore testimony to the entire surgical success of his hip operation.

Future Plans Our first get together in 1987 will take place on Sunday 12th April with two visits. Firstly, members are invited to our home 'Timberley', 12 Ringley Park Avenue, Reigate, Surrey RH2 7DN at noon for a look round the garden followed by a ploughman's lunch. Then at 2.30 p.m. we shall move on to the Reigate Headquarters Training Centre of the Surrey Fire Brigade where our Chairman will show slides not previously seen by members.

Those members who are coming to our home for the first time may send a SAE for a map, and we would appreciate members notifying us if they are coming, for catering purposes by 4th April. (As we shall be out of the country until March 20th, maps will not be sent out until after that date.)

SOUTH WEST.

As I start to write these notes, I am looking forward to warmer days ahead. The present cold spell will be a good test for the hardiness of our European Heaths and I have no doubt that all will survive except for some wind burn on *E. lusitanica*. Before the snow arrived *E. x. darleyensis* and *E. lusitanica* were flowering well, *E. x veitchii* 'Gold Tips' was about to open and some of the *E. carneas* were in bloom. The temperature in my glass house is being maintained at about 2-3°C so as to keep the frost away from the Cape Heaths some of which are in flower. Because of the low day time temperatures the glasshouse ventilation is a problem and therefore the Cape Heaths are not getting their fair share of fresh air.

The Group's first meeting of 1987 will be at Lytchett Matravers Village Hall on Saturday 4th April when Mrs. Diane Jones will give an illustrated talk entitled "Creating a Heather Garden on Alkaline Soil". There will also be a table Show of two classes. The first will be "A collection of heathers in bloom" and the second 'A collection of heathers shown for foliage effect'. Exhibits in both classes should be shown in a vase or bowl. The meeting will start at 2.00 p.m. Lytchett Matravers is situated 6 miles from Poole and 1 mile west of the Poole to Blandford road. The village hall is on the west side of the High Street just north of The Rose & Crown Inn. There will be a charge to cover the cost of refreshments and the hire of the hall, and there will be prizes for the Table Show winners.

Our second meeting will be at Wansdyke Nursery and the Pygmy Pinetum at Devizes on Saturday 9th May at 2.00 p.m. This nursery specialises in dwarf conifers and is owned by Mr. & Mrs. von Klaveren. It is reached by approaching Devizes along the A 360 from the south and turning left into Hillworth Road where the nursery is ¼ mile along on the left. After spending the afternoon at the nursery we have been invited to tea at Des and Sybil Perry's home at 26 Park Road, Market Lavington. On leaving the nursery, members should travel south along the A 360 to West Lavington, turning left along the B 3098 to Market Lavington. Park Road is on the left just past the school.

The third meeting of the year will take place at Ivy Cottage, Ansty, Dorset. This garden is mentioned in the "Yellow Book" and is owned by Mrs. Anne Stevens. We will meet there on Saturday 20th June at 2.00 p.m. Ansty is about 3 miles N.W. of Milton Abbas and just below Ansty Cross. The garden is about ¼ mile down the lane near the Fox Inn. The garden is a plantsman's garden and specialises in moisture loving plants and contains a national collection of Trollius. There will be an entry charge of 40p and refreshments will be provided at reasonable cost.

For your diary — our fourth meeting will be on 22nd August and will be a two garden visit to Bill and Joan Vicary's garden at Ashurst near Southampton and then my garden at Totton Southampton.

SCRAP BOWL - Titbits of News from Members.

Heathers in Surrey. In some ways 1986 was an extraordinary year for heathers. The cold spells early in the year took more toll of *Calluna vulgaris* and *Daboecia* than of other species. Surprisingly *Erica erigena* suffered less than usual. Old and mature plants of *Calluna* appeared to be more susceptible than younger plants, perhaps because they were more exposed to cold and freezing winds. But by late summer the surviving plants were flowering better than for many years, particularly in some of its wild habitats.

Some cultivars of *E. tetralix* flowered exceptionally early — even in April — while in some cases omitted the first flush of single flowers, and when it started to flower at the end of June produced double flowers straight away. I was surprised at the end of October when one plant reverted to single flowers — the first time that I have noticed this happening.

The absence of night frosts in late autumn encouraged heathers to continue flowering later than usual. *E. tetralix* 'Alba Mollis' and 'Hookstone Pink' were still flowering in November. *E. terminalis* continued to flower until the end of the year. In spite of the mildness of the weather, neither 'Autumn Glow' nor 'Saint Nick' had produced flowers before the end of December, although both had coloured buds. Another late-flowering *Calluna*, 'Jan' already had a few flowers open on the 31st December. As might have been expected *E. lusitanica* was already flowering before the end of October and will, I expect, continue in flower until next May.

Bees and Butterflies. Shortly after the snow goes, when the soil begins to warm up, . . . One can hardly think of spring without turning thought to heathers. As an ardent lover of butterflies, the early flowering heathers are an added source of pleasure for me because they attract and help to sustain the early species that have overwintered as adults. They are also valuable to the emerging queen bumble bees when little other nectar is available. Indeed it is on the flowers of *Erica Carnea* 'King George' where I usually record my first bumble bee of the season, around May 15th.

News from B.C. Canada. I have enjoyed my first year as a member of the Heather Society, and look forward to a long association. Being born in Yorkshire I probably came to know heather at an early age but was more closely introduced while working in nurseries in Southern England in the early 70's. My father introduced me to the Heather Society in 1982 when he passed on his collection of Year Books from 1963. He is credited with forming the Pacific North West Heather Society which now has become the North American Heather Society.

I have been growing heathers here in Sardinia, 60 miles north of Vancouver since 1974. Our busiest year was 4 years ago when we grew 130,000 in 4" pots. For next season all but 20,000 will be *E. carnea* and *E. x. darleyensis* cultivars. Members are always most welcome here.

Heather 'transplant'. In the "New Scientist" 30th Jan. 1986 issue the following was reported 'An acre of Ling heather is being moved from Forestry Commission land in Surrey to Hampstead Heath. The G.L.C. which is organising the transplant says that the heather (on the Heath) has been absent for 45 years. Stuart Carruthers, the G.L.C. ecologist, who is supervising the move, has already transferred 2 plots of heather, one to Suffolk and one to Hampstead Heath'

***E. cinerea* 'Pallida' and 'Pallas'.** We grow dwarf conifers and heathers and have never had *E. cinerea* 'Pallida' to our knowledge. The plant we grow and sell as 'Pallas' is exactly the same colour and flower size as 'Colligan Bridge', although the plant habit is very different Purple is a better description than pink.
