Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers: single, candyfloss-pink (H8), July–August.

Foliage: dull green changing to red in spring.

Habit: spreading; after 3 years 20cm tall (when pruned), 40cm across.

Origins: chance seedling found by Dr Colin D. Rogers in his own garden, 2002.

“The foliage turns red in spring, from the tips in May to full branch in June;  
flowering is very early for a *Calluna*.”
