Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers: semi-double, heliotrope (H12); July–October. Foliage: green gold in summer, turning bronze red (orange tips and tints) in winter. Habit: forming an open mound.

"Gold semi-double *Calluna*: long bloom time; sun- and fungus-resistant gold. Its twisting new growth above the flowers creates an interesting texture to the winter garden."

Origins: sport on 'Tib'; found by Ken Hutchins at Oregon Rhododendrons, Corvalis, Oregon, in 1994.
