Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers: normal, sepals & petals white, anthers tan; flowering on principal shoot and then on lower axillary shoots; starts to bloom in June, until September.

Foliage: glabrous, green.

Habit in garden: spreading; after 3 years to 30cm wide; to 15cm tall.

Origins: wild plant at Lettergesh, County Galway.

“Colleen Bawn” is an Anglicized form of *an cailín bán* (a fair-haired girl), and has been used as a plant name for white-flowered plants (e.g. *Narcissus* ‘Colleen Bawn’).
