Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers: single, corolla and calyx amethyst (H1); June–October. Foliage: shoots with bicoloured golden ends with brilliant glossy red inner leaves, colours deepen to orange and red in winter cold. Habit: compact, spreading, 20 × 40cm. "Distinctive bicolored foliage gives winter foliage color in areas that can not grow *Calluna*.

The red is much more brilliant than other gold *E. cinerea*."

Origins: sport on *E. cinerea* 'Atropurpurea', found by Ken Hutchins at Oregon Rhododendrons, Corvalis, Oregon, in 1994.

Named by Ken Hutchins: "Yule for the winter/Christmas color display, Fire for the flame-like mixture of red and orange foliage."
