Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers: single, half again larger than typical 10 × 5mm;  
corolla lilac pink (H11), calyx heliotrope (H12); December–May.

Foliage: very dark green with red tips in spring.

Habit: neat, low, spreading mound; 25 × 50cm.

“Extra large flowers and leaves, on a tidy spreading mound.”

Origins: sport on ‘W. G. Pine’ (?), found in 1997 by Ken Hutchins at  
Oregon Rhododendrons, Corvallis, Oregon.

Named by Karla Lortz; a play on the word “polyploid” although  
*no* evidence was presented at the time of registration for  
any abnormal chromosome number in this clone.
