Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers densely clustered in fascicles on short lateral shoots; corolla small, obovoid, elongated, to 5mm long, less than 1.5mm across towards base; sepals up to 8: stamens absent; style malformed and emergent. Foliage: dark green. Origins: found on 28 September 2009 on Sandford Heath (SY 93727 90374), near Wareham, Dorset, by Dr J. F. Wright; the original plant is still alive at that place, 2 October 2011. This is an abnormal plant and the characters have been retained in cultivation.

Named in recognition of SANDFORD HERITAGE, a Heritage Lottery Fund project (2011–2012) that enables the people of Sandford to discover their local history and wildlife.
