Its characteristics at the time of registration were

Flowers single, deep rose-pink (H7) verging on cerise (H6); July–September.  
Corolla urceolate, 6mm long, maximum width 4mm; anthers ruby (H5); style-end ruby (H5);  
calyx ruby (H5), sepals 3mm long.  
Mature foliage dark green; bright green when young.  
Habit compact.

Origins: wild-collected, found in August 2013 at Frensham Ponds Common, Surrey,  
by Molly Rose Hall;  
personally propagated by Miss Hall at her father’s nursery,  
Whitehall Nursery, Red Lane, Headley Down, Hampshire.
